As of June 30, 2017, the Fund's A share received a 4-star Rating for the 5 Year period and a 3-star Overall Rating in the Short-Term Bond category.

The Morningstar Rating for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. The Fund had the following ratings as of 6/30/17 for the 3- year and Overall periods, respectfully: (1) for APIMX: 3 yr, 2 stars; 5 yr, 4 stars; Overall, 3 stars; (2) for AFMMX: 3 yr, 1 stars; 5 yr, 3 stars; Overall, 2 stars; (3) for APIBX: 3 yr, 1 stars; Overall, 1 stars. The number of funds in the category: 3 yr, 450; 5 yr, 376; Overall 450.

As of the May 31, 2017 prospectus, amended June 21, 2017, the Short Term Bond Fund total annual operating expenses before fee waivers for the Class A, Class L, and Institutional shares are 1.24%, 2.24%, 1.24%, respectively. In the interest of limiting expenses of the Fund, the Adviser has entered into a five year contractual expense limitation agreement with the Trust, effective February 1, 2017, in which the Adviser has agreed to waive or limit its fees and assume other expenses of the Fund (excluding interest, taxes, brokerage commissions and other expenditures capitalized in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles or other extraordinary expenses not incurred in the ordinary course of business) so that the Fund's ratio of total annual operating expenses is limited to 0.95% for Class A Shares, 1.95% for Class L Shares, and 0.95% for Institutional Class Shares.
